HRHCare provides the highest quality primary and preventive health care to over 110,000 patients, regardless of insurance status or ability to pay, throughout a 10 county region of southeastern New York State. We are a nonprofit, New York State licensed, Joint Commission accredited, Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), recognized by the National Committee on Quality Assurance (NCQA) as a Level 3 Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH). Our comprehensive services include family medicine specialists in adult and pediatric care; obstetrical and gynecological care; oral care; behavioral health counseling; nutrition; WIC services; health education; and a full complement of outreach, translation, transportation, benefits counseling and health insurance enrollment assistance.

HRHCare has a commitment to the communities we serve and works to improve community health through partnerships and collaborations with key stakeholders including local businesses, social service agencies, housing organizations, food banks, farm worker alliances and other community organizations.

The New HRHCare Health Center in Hudson

HRHCare is proud to officially open our newest site called Hudson Health Center. This new facility now offers HRHCare's affordable and holistic family health care services directly to the residents of Columbia and Greene Counties. With recent additions to our staff we are expanding to our goal of 3,500 patients, offering evening and weekend hours, and will be providing dental care in 2015. The Health Center is located at 750 Union Street in Hudson, New York.



Groundbreaking for New Peekskill Addition

HRHCare broke ground for a new addition to our historic Peekskill location, founded nearly 40 years ago! Peekskill Mayor Frank Catalina and other elected officials joined our HRHCare Board Chair Honorable Alan Steiner and President and CEO Anne Kauffmar Nolon, MPH, to celebrate this milestone for HRHCare and the entire Peekskill community. This new \$16 million addition will add more than 20,000 square feet on to the existing building and provide a

new south side entrance way. As well as creating easier access for patients, the addition will increase clinical capacity and allow for the expansion of lab services and the integration of case management. The renovation will transform a historic Peekskill building, built in the 1930's, into a state-of-the-art health care facility.

Highlights on Long Island

Welcoming 5 Suffolk County Health Centers to the HRHCare Family

We are proud to welcome 5 new Health Centers in Suffolk County to the HRHCare family in 2014! In May HRHCare opened the newly renovated, state-of-the-art Kraus Family Health Center of the Hamptons on the Southampton Hospital campus after assuming its leadership from the Suffolk County Department of Health. HRHCare has assumed leadership and operations of the Maxine S. Postal Tri-Community Health Center in Amityville, the Martin Luther King Jr. Health Center in Wyandanch, the Marilyn Shellabarger Health Center in Shirley and the Health Center at Patchogue. A total of 60,000 new patients will be added as we continue to work with Suffolk County throughout 2015.

As President and CEO, Michael J. Dowling has continued North Shore-LIJ Health System's dedication to delivering world-class clinical care and pioneering medical research and education. With 17 hospitals, about 400 outpatient physician practices and a full complement of long-term care services, North Shore-LIJ is New York State's largest integrated health care system and private employer and has become one of the largest health systems in the nation.

Growing up in Limerick, Ireland, Mr. Dowling earned his master's degree from Fordham University and began a public service career upon moving to New York State. While serving as Commissioner of the New York State Department of Social Services, he became a great supporter of the community health center movement and a friend of HRHCare after meeting Anne Kauffman Nolon during her many trips to Albany. Following 7 years as State Director of Health, Education and Human Services, Mr. Dowling brought his social justice and health care expertise to North Shore-LIJ in 1995, becoming President and CEO in 2002.





GLENN & MERRY ANNE VOGT and JOHN CRABTREE

Co-owners of RiverMarket Bar & Kitchen and Crabtree's Kittle House

Restaurateurs Glenn and Merry Anne Vogt and John Crabtree have brought their passion and expertise to some of New York State's most successful and innovative dining venues. Along with their panache for serving fine food and wine, they have been pioneers in serving local, natural and sustainable products and advocates for Hudson Valley farmers and farmworker health.

Honing his skills at Xaviar's Restaurant in Piermont and Manhattan's famous Montrachet, Glenn Vogt first met John Crabtree upon gaining a position at his venerable restaurant, Crabtree's Kittle House. Together, along with Vogt's wife Merry Anne, they opened RiverMarket Bar & Kitchen in Tarrytown; a restaurant and fresh market supporting local agriculture by featuring the products of Hudson Valley farmers. When made aware of HRHCare's dedication to farmworker health, Glenn Vogt saw his own culinary mission as complimentary to that of HRHCare. "We want to educate people on the

bountiful, accessible food from Hudson Valley farms," he said. "Thank God for HRHCare who reaches out to these farms to make sure that the workers are healthy and getting what they need. We are doing what we love, and to be associated with HRHCare because of that is a really special honor."

Along with their dedication to natural, sustainable and humanely sourced food, both the Vogts and Crabtree have raised awareness for important charitable causes. As the General Manager of Windows on the World at One World Trade Center during the 9/11 attacks, Glenn Vogt helped conceive Windows of Hope; a charity which distributed over \$30 million to the families of victims who worked in the food and hospitality industries. In 2011, John Crabtree launched the Amy Marie Crabtree Foundation in honor of his beloved wife who bravely fought brain cancer for 19 months. The Foundation supports brain cancer research and support and several other programs benefitting those in need.

Early Cancer Detection and Prevention Program & Special Interview with Jill Rose

"When you're first faced with an illness; the first thing you want is it to go away. I first discovered that I

was experiencing a physical change and thinking it was probably just nothing to be concerned about. When I did go to the doctor, that's when they discovered that it was breast cancer.

It's been very difficult navigating the system. Initially, when you're faced with a developing cancer, you want somebody to take over and solve that problem for you. It's not something you have any knowledge about how to solve, or where to turn. So quickly you go to your primary care physician.

As a friend of HRHCare and Anne Nolon I've witnessed, this feeling of individual care and individual concern throughout the organization.

In navigating my own situation, I wish I had the support HRHCare delivers...help with navigating - to find doctors, make appointments, support - that intimate, personal, caring arm that people need when they're facing health issues. Not having access or knowledge of materials and

resources that say "look for these signs, early detection", is a big challenge for people facing cancer. The importance of knowing there is an organization that really will help you, regardless of your situation, and really care for you. That's what I see with HRHCare.

There is a whole team at HRHCare that works with you, and understands you as a human being, because we're all so different and have different lifestyles and different diets and different cultures. We all need that personalized service. HRHCare knows that. They deliver that. That's their mission. Even if someone doesn't have insurance. HRHCare sends the message. If you think something needs to be checked out, then come in. Don't let the lack of insurance stop you. Have it looked at. Have it taken care of. Trust us. We will support you. That mission is fantastic.

You can make a difference in survival and care and community for everyone. We live in this big community together, but there's vast differences. What kind of world do you want to live in? What message do you want to send to others? You want to give to HRHCare to help yourself, and everyone else benefits.

That builds great community!"






"HRHCare helped me learn a lot about my pregnancy and how to keep myself healthy. They have been really good with me."

Placido came from Oaxaca, Mexico, seven years ago to find work on the farms of Orange County, New York. In mid-April 2013, he began feeling sick and made an appointment at the HRHCare Alamo Clinic in Goshen. After running preliminary tests, Dr. Figueroa referred him to the Westchester Medical Center where further testing revealed he had a cancerous tumor growing on his left kidney. Overcoming the fear of not seeing his family in Oaxaca again and losing his livelihood, Placido underwent emergency surgery to remove the cancer and has made a full recovery.
