

Timothy Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York, joined Scott LaRue, President and CEO of ArchCare, and HRHCare executives to bless the van at the HRHCare Alamo Health Center in Goshen.

This 33-foot health center on wheels brings care directly to people who often go without it due to lack of transportation, limited funds, or the inability to leave work without jeopardizing their livelihood. The mobile health center currently travels throughout the Hudson Valley, visiting farms, community agencies, and churches to deliver care, provide health education, and connect people with ongoing services at local HRHCare health centers.

In November, we relocated our Atrium and Livingston Street sites in Poughkeepsie to a brand new health center at 75 Washington Street. 

LOCAL IMPACT Grant

HRHCare was honored to receive a \$2.05 million grant from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to launch the Hudson Community Health Alliance. This coalition with the Rockland and Westchester County Departments of Health and other local agencies has created successful programs and campaigns to encourage healthful behavior and help prevent and control chronic health issues such as obesity, diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. The funds were given to HRHCare as part of a \$7 million statewide grant administered through New York State Department of Health's Local Initiatives for Multi Sector Public Health Action, or Local IMPACT, program.

ALL OF US Research Program National Institutes of Health



HRHCare President and CEO Anne Kauffman Nolon, as featured in an overview of the project in the *New York Times* (July 23, 2016) Photographed by Greg Vigliotti In July 2016, HRHCare was selected by the National Institutes of Health as one of six Federally Qualified Health Centers to participate in the All of Us Research Program (formerly the Precision Medicine Initiative). HRHCare was chosen based on our history of early adaptation, strong leadership, and previous experience with clinical research programs.

All of Us, led by Eric Dishman, a Silicon Valley innovator formerly with Intel, is a research project to determine the impact of lifestyle, environment, and genetics on individual health. The project is designed to crowdsource data from a million participants nationwide for long-term disease treatment and prevention.

The role of HRHCare is to identify best practices in engaging the diverse populations we serve in biomedical research, through a pilot program of 100 participants. The pilot is especially exciting because it gives our communities the chance to become active partners in scientific research populations from which they have been historically excluded.



Joint Commission 2016 Accreditation

HRHCare completed its seventh successful triennial on-site survey by The Joint Commission on October 28th. The Joint Commission recognizes health care organizations for quality of care, safety, and respect for patient rights. The visiting surveyors in ambulatory care and behavioral health acknowledged the strong systems in place at HRHCare and made a few recommendations for making them even more reliable. Many of the recommendations have already been implemented, and others will be added in the next few months. Congratulations to our care teams and departments on achieving this continued recognition!





NACHC AWARD Alan Steiner

On August 29th, the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) honored the Honorable Alan L. Steiner, HRHCare Community Health Board Chair. Mr. Steiner received the Ethel Bond Memorial Consumer Award, which was accepted on his behalf by HRHCare President and CEO Anne Kauffman Nolon. The award presentation took place during NACHC's 47th annual Community Health Institute & EXPO in Chicago, a national conference attended by nearly 2,000 community health leaders from across the country.

Honoring the Hands

Agricultural Workers

Agriculture continues to thrive as one of Long Island's largest industries, yet agricultural workers and their families continue to suffer from high rates of poor nutrition, asthma, and musculoskeletal conditions due to a lack of access to primary and preventive health care. This past July, HRHCare was proud to partner again with Long Island Sustainable Winegrowers to host the second annual Honoring the Hands event at Martha Clara Vineyards in Riverhead, raising nearly \$78,000 toward the HRHCare Agricultural Health Fund. This fund supports HRHCare Days of Health as well as the future purchase of a mobile health center van to serve the agricultural workers of Suffolk County.

Days of Health

HRHCare hosted two Days of Health in 2016, held at Pindar Vineyards in Peconic and St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church in Riverhead. Over 100 agricultural workers and their family members were able to receive free health care screenings, vaccines, nutrition counseling, and schedule follow-up appointments at an HRHCare health center convenient to them.

Expanding Health Care Access

On October 15th, the HRHCare Foundation hosted the 12th annual Cornucopia Benefit at Crabtree's Kittle House in Chappaqua. The event raised nearly \$250,000 to support HRHCare in providing comprehensive, high quality primary and preventive care to people in need throughout the Hudson Valley and Long Island.

ArchCare, the health care arm of the Archdiocese of New York with whom HRHCare partnered to launch the mobile health center, was honored for their tireless work to expand health care access to some of New York's most vulnerable populations. Laura DeMaria of Hemlock Hill Farm was also honored for her dedication to providing naturally raised, hormone-free meat and produce to restaurants and markets across the Hudson Valley.
