

## INTEGRATING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH & PRIMARY CARE

## Overview

Hudson River Health Care (HRHCare) serves nearly 9,000 patients with co-existing mental health and primary care needs, as do many federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) nationally. Research suggests that nearly 20% of primary care visits relate to mental health issues. Additionally, patients with such needs are more likely to seek out services within primary care settings instead of specialty care settings, necessitating primary care-based interventions.

Providing high-quality integrated primary and behavioral care is shown to reduce preventable emergency department visits, hospitalizations, and re-admissions, and to improve the patient experience. Sustaining and expanding this effective and cost-efficient model of care requires appropriate incentives and funding that recognize the critical role of FQHCs and the complex patients they serve.

## **Our Work**

HRHCare has implemented the following strategies to support integration:

- Routine behavioral health screenings during primary care visits for alcohol abuse, substance abuse, and depression. Individuals who screen positive in any area of the simple questionnaire are further assessed and connected to an onsite social worker on the same day
- Comprehensive and seamless integrated behavioral health and medical care services from initial screening and assessment, to diagnosis, to the development of a treatment plan, to appropriate treatment and referrals. We provide individual and group counseling, patient education, and care management
- Multiple integrated and co-located services through partnerships with other providers, including embedding an Article 31 mental health provider at HRHCare Yonkers, and HRHCare primary care staff at an Article 31 mental health site in the Hudson Valley
- Adoption of the evidence-based IMPACT model for depression care. The essential elements of this model include multidisciplinary team-based care, depression care managers, designated psychiatrists, and stepped care to change treatment depending on patients' needs
